Albuquerque Recycling Project

At the March Board meeting Derek Gonzales, a member of the mayor's ABQ Green program, gave a presentation describing how the ABQ Green program has been developed and is progressing. After 7 years of conversation and negotiation the method of curbside recycling has been redesigned and is currently in the process of being deployed in all the city's neighborhoods. The plan is to have blue rolling recycle bins, similar to the black trash bins but smaller, deployed to all neighborhoods by the end of 2009. There has been no change in what will be picked up curbside, but rather the manner in which they are gathered up and placed at curbside on their regular trash pickup day. Number 1 and 2 plastic bottles, cans, newspapers, office paper, magazines, including glossy pages, and corrugated cardboard can all be placed in these bins and do not need to be bagged or bundled separately. Derek explained that cans and bottles should all be rinsed; can and bottle labels, caps and bottle cap rings, envelope windows need not be removed. Egg cartons, cereal and cracker box type cardboard, Styrofoam, and plastic coated cardboard cannot be recycled. It is possible to take a tour of the Intermediate Processing Facility (IPF or waste recycling facility) on the west side. School-age children are welcome to take this tour. 505-761-8100 or see www.cabq.gov/solidwaste/recycling.
